

'The Plank'



At the heart of Studio 7 is 'The Plank', Conny Plank's custom made 56 channel recording console. The console is totally unique, hand built by Conny Plank, Peter Lang, and Michael Zahl in 1970 and originally situated in Conny's studio in Cologne. It was moved to Studio 7, London, in October 2015.

Nicknamed 'The Plank' the studio 7 console was designed by Conny Plank in around 1970 and and continuously upgraded until Conny's death in 1987. The desk has been painstakingly hand laminated in cherry wood reputedly taken from one single cherry tree from Conny's garden. It has 56 hand-made channels, each one featuring custom parametric EQ, hand wound preamps and rare germanium transistors. As part of it's unique design the power rail runs off a 32 volt supply rather than the conventional 48 volts meaning that the rail runs hotter than other consoles giving the desk it's legendary warm tone and magical ability to magnify audio clarity while boosting harmonic resonance. The desk's signal path is deliberately uncomplicated, controlled by real switches and relays rather than FET switches. The incredible custom-made EQ section is based on a classic Baxandall circuit and has been designed to Conny's own specifications so the circuitry changes characteristics as the cut/ boost control is swept through the centre position to assign specific Q and frequency characteristics separately to boost and cut. Preamps are a classic transformer based mic input using Pickatron RUP505M transformers. All channels feature a unique channel integrated patchbay with auto send function routing any channel to any other channel (or combination of channels) with a single button. Each channel also includes 48 V power and a wide range of auxiliary busses. Metering comes from the original 1970s plasma display bridge. The display bridge also has a fully integrated bantam jack patchbay for routing to and from hardware units.

Conny Plank



Born on the 3rd May 1940 Konrad 'Conny' Plank initially worked as a sound engineer in the 1960s for Marlene Dietrich before moving into studio engineering and production from the late 1960s until his death in 1987. Renowned for a production style that prioritised authenticity and spontaneity over precision and technicality, Plank is considered one of the greatest producers of the 20th century and a pioneer in the genre of 'Krautrock'. Notoriously averse to the limelight of celebrity, Conny shunned publicity, preferring instead to work without distraction from the privacy of his studio. This carefully focused work ethic ensured a prodigious catalogue of work from the 17 years he was active in music production. Despite not being a public figure his fame as a production pioneer rapidly grew within the music industry garnering him many high profile admirers, not least Brian Eno who became a friend and student of Conny's production style recording many of his 70s classic albums at Conny's Studio before going on to co-produce Devo's first album there in 1978 with David Bowie.

Bowie's classic 'Berlin Trilogy' of Albums produced by Eno were inspired by Conny's style of production which had left a lasting impression on both Eno and Bowie who cite him as a major influence on their work. From the mid 70s Conny Plank branched out to a more diverse range of acts working with such legendary names as Scorpions, Eurythmics, Echo and The Bunnymen, Flock of Seagulls, DAF, The Meteors, Ultravox and Killing joke. Always interested in new musical ideas and cutting edge sounds he also sought out American Rap pioneers 'Whodini' at the very inception of the genre, producing their much vaunted self titled debut album in 1983.





Live Room - Studio Specs

The Studio 7 live room is aprox 500 square feet in size, has 32 line outs and 8 lines in. Continuing the seventies inspired design of the control room hessian coated panels of sound proofing absorb muddy low end frequencies while it's pinewood linings enhance the presence of mid range and high frequency reflections. A large acoustic window gives a clear view of the control room beyond and a specially built tall cupboard houses 4 full sized wheel-able acoustic screens. The live room has a smaller alcove at one end with five lockable equipment cupboards that will ensure safe storage of all visiting artist's equipment. The live room is easily big enough for pre-recording rehearsals and live pre-production. It comes equipped with a 16 channel mixing desk, a PA and a large selection of drum kits, amps and equipment.

Vocal Booth:

Studio 7's second live room is a vocal booth/ dead room situated right next to the control room. It has 16 inputs and is big enough to incorporate a full sized drum kit. It is fully acoustically lined to stop most audio reflection. It has sliding glass doors at the front providing a perfect view into the control room and a live video feed connects to the main live room providing any singer or musician recording a live session a view of the band.
